

Deputy Premier Tours BCIT Campuses

The Honourable Rita Johnston, Deputy Premier, Minister of Transportation and Highways, visited BCIT's Aviation and Civil and Structural Departments in early October. At the Civil and Structural laboratories, the Minister was given a testing demonstration and then made a brief speech to a BCIT Civil and Structural engineering class.

In her speech, the Minister expressed a very positive view of future job opportunities in highways design and development. She commented on changes from the traditional design in upcoming projects — such as the Barnet highway, where designated lanes will encourage car-pooling and mass transit.

The Minister noticed the five female students in the room and said she hopes to see an increase of women in the field. Following the visit in Burnaby, the Minister was briefed on the British Columbia aerospace industry's developments and taken on a tour of the BCIT Sea Island Aviation Campus in Richmond.
