Marketing alumni reunion raises funds for student awards



To commemorate 10 years at BCIT and the success of her students throughout the years, Marketing program head Glenna Urbshadt organized an alumni night for Sales and Small Business grads on March 30th, 1996. Proceeds from the event totalled close to \$2,000 and will be directed towards student awards over the next few years.

Urbshadt was able to track down 650 of her 750 former students and was thrilled with a turnout of close to 350 people. "Organizing the event took close to 3000 phone calls," she said with a laugh, "and I don't plan on doing it again too soon, maybe it's something we could do on a five-year basis."

An enthusiastic response after the event including thank you notes and networking opportunities pleased Urbshadt to no end. "It was great to hear what



everyone is up to and it was also a chance to remind alumni that BCIT is still here and job postings have been coming in."

As part of the response, Urbshadt analyzed what her former students are doing. The results show a very high retention rate in their area of study.

BCIT confers first bachelor's degree

In a ceremony on June 21 which President Brian Gillespie described as "perhaps the biggest milestone in BCIT's history," Computer Systems Technology graduate Joe Defries received BCIT's first bachelor of technology degree.

Defries, who works in project management at BC Hydro and is partowner of Able Security and Alarm Systems, has been working towards the degree for four and a half years through part-time studies. He began his commitment to lifelong learning in 1972 graduating from BCIT with a diploma in Electrical Engineering. Before embarking on a degree in Computer Systems, Mr. Defries took an additional 13 core courses to meet the prerequisites. He is contemplating his next step "I am thinking about doing a business degree next."

"Today's ceremony has moved BCIT into another era—an era of providing a practical degree option in post-secondary education. Now we can open even more doors to career and job opportunities," said Gillespie after the ceremony.

ASTTBC News

The first Limited License in Professional Engineering from the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of BC (APEGBC) was presented in April 1996 to John Beggs, AScT, employed by BC Hydro. Implemented by APEGBC in September 1995, Limited Licensure in engineering geosciences gives formal or authorization and public recognition to qualified practitioners in natural and applied sciences who possess expertise within a narrow field that falls within the

practice of those professions as defined under the *Engineers and Geoscientists Act.*

This is an historic event for Applied Science Technologists and will certainly expand the career opportunities for BCIT and college graduates", according to ASTTBC Executive Director John Leech (BCIT grad 1970/71). A former member of the BCIT Board of Governors and a Past President of the BCIT Alumni Association, John Leech noted that this recognition is one of many that ASTTBC has achieved since acquiring its own professional statute in 1985. Armand Paris, BASc., MASc., P.Eng. BCIT Mathematics Instructor 1964 - 1982

When BCIT Math instructor, Armand Paris, died suddenly in 1982, an endowment fund to annually provide BCIT's top Math student in first year Food Technology with scholarships was established by family, friends and colleagues. Since that time, 14 students have received scholarships totalling \$3,950.

While the fund was significant 14 years ago, declining interest rates are reducing the amount of interest earned each year for disbursement, while costs for students continue to increase.
