# ACCOUNTING and AUDITING SERVICE for SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS

The students are available from October to May, and will provide a complete survey of the accounting system, with recommendations for imporvement, direction in establishing a uniform accounting basis, so that all associations can use the B.C.S.F. Computer, and auditing services so that government requirements can be met with regard to provincial grants.

The program is operated in conjunction with the B.C. Sports Federation and the deadline for application to this service was September 30.

It is hoped that those of you who are involved in amateur sports, will contact Messrs. Woolley, Thurgood or Dick, for utilization of the service in the next season.

This is an excellent opportunity for students to have practical experience in their field.

### BOARD of GOVERNORS CHAIRPERSON

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The Board of Governors of the British Columbia Institute of Technology is pleased to announce the appointments of Dr. Robert T. Morrison as Chairperson and Mr. Ron Isaak as Vice Chairperson. Both appointments to be effective immediately for a one year term of office.

Head of the Vancouver General Hospital Department of Nuclear Medicine, Dr. Morrison's experience ranges from consulting in nuclear medicine with major medical centres throughout North America to direct involvement in the Triumph Project at the University of British Columbia. He has 45 publications on a variety of topics; has made thirty-nine formal scientific presentations and has received eleven research grants.

Mr. Isaak is Director and partner in Cameron Surveying and Engineering Ltd. He graduated from the British Columbia Institute of Technology in the Civil and Structural Engineering Technology in 1968, and is presently Chairman of the Society of Engineering Technologists of British Columbia. He is also Director of the BCIT Alumni Association and was selected by the Alumni as representative to the Board of Governors.

The appointments of Dr. Morrison and Ron Isaak by the Board of Governors comes under the British Columbia Institute of Technology Act of July 4, 1974, giving the Board autonomous authority to administer the Institute. The Board of Governors consists of fifteen, eight of which are appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, representing the community at large.
