

B.C.'s Justice System Still Weak

Not having a minimum sentence is a big loop hole

he recent explosion of gang violence has lower mainland citizens wondering where tomorrow's next spray of bullets will be coming from. Police Chief Jim Chu has re-



sponded to public concern and has announced that cops will be focused on making arrests on the many unsolved gang killings of late. This comes in the wake of the eldest Bacon brother and his close Red Scorpion associate being released on bail. Allowing known, dangerous gangsters to live among the public has left citizens wondering when the justice system will crack down harder on gang leaders.

Federal Justice Minister Rob Nicholson, while admitting that drugs are the root cause of the gang problem, has come up with what he thinks are some solutions to combat organized crime's habit for drug dealing. Here are the highlights: A one year mandatory jail term for dealing drugs and a two year mandatory jail term for dealing drugs to youth. Nicholson also announced that people who are caught growing large amounts of pot have to serve a maximum 14 year jail term.

Nicholson's jail terms are not going to throw fear into the hearts of drug dealers. The mandatory jail time numbers are soft and the maximum leaves too much to the judge's discretion. The maximum penalty of 14 years is strong but, what is the minimum? House arrest, a fine? When will the maximum be implemented? Nicholson's attempts at reforming drug dealing penalties are a step in the right direction but the jail terms are vague at best. The public is still seeking a justice system with a spine.

BCIT's Ecological Restoration Degree One of a Kind in Canada

eginning this September, BCIT students will be able to apply for a Bachelor of Technology in Ecological Restoration. Students will study how human influences, such as urban sprawl, invasive species expansions, and direct damage affect the natural environment. These factors combined with the resulting increase in the number of threatened and endangered species has prompted BCIT to create a program that focuses on ecological restoration initiatives. This degree is the first of its kind in Canada. Applicants with previous environmental education have the opportunity to be fast-tracked into the program.



- For your Canada Student Loan, contact the National Student Loans Service Centre at 1-888-815-4514 (TTY for the hearing impaired: 1-888-815-4556).
- For your provincial student loan, contact your provincial student financial aid office at 1-800-561-1818.

If you think you might have trouble paying back your student loans, there are federal and provincial programs available to help you stay on track.

Ask about the repayment options available to you. For example, the new Repayment Assistance Plan will ensure your Canada Student Loan payments will never be higher than what you can reasonably afford.



ust like any other smart student out there, I jump on the chance for a free thing. Even more so when this free thing happens to be my favourite child-hood toy: Lego. Everyone has seen the pictures online of large scale Lego models, but you really can't appreciate them until you see them in person along with the little plaque sitting next to each piece listing off how many pieces were used, and how long it took to build.

A few small scale exhibits stand outside, whetting your palette for what's to come. There's a mini *Stargate*, from the aforementioned show, a "future plane", as well as an all terrain multi-purpose vehicle looking like something out of *Transformers*. All of those displays were pretty eye catching, but nothing compared to what was to come inside. Greeting you is a mini Lego World, terrain and everything, where everything is built out of small lego pieces, not those jumbo toddler lego blocks. All modes of transportation seem to be on display. Everything from plains, trains, automobiles, and some other unique ways to move around.


The exhibits largest piece, a rocket ship, is made from over 16,500 normal sized Lego blocks, took 399 hours to build. As impressive as the rocket ship was however, the piece that caught my attention was the ground transportation exhibit. Showcasing a semi-truck and trailer, trolley, motorcycle, old jalopy, and horse and buggy. The attention to detail was amazing.

Displaying ships, rockets, blips, helicopters, and trains, there is certainly a lot on display. For the kids, they have mini Lego car races, as well as a kid's sized F1 car to sit in with a video of them racing. Hearing the screams and yelps, it is good to know that the tradition of Lego is still being passed on to the next generation.

While I can keep on trying to describe the scenes to you, all I can leave you with are a few pictures of the exhibits and recommend that you go down there yourself to see it. Be sure to take your student card to get a discounted rate., if not its \$18.50, a bit of a steep price, but well worth it.



As of March 7th, even more lego creations have been added to the exhibit, including a plasma race car track, a Z2 spaceship, and a model of the upcoming Airport and King Edward stations along the Canada Line SkyTrain built by the Vancouver LEGO Club.


to see him and his accent smoke a cigarette and flip off everyone on the red carpet FOR those movies.

anding in Vancouver in the Spring of 2008, IT-SAZOO Productions have been making quite a name for themselves; they were recently named "Favourite New Company for 2008" by the Westender Newspaper. ITSAZOO was started in Victoria in 2004 by three UVic Theatre students that wanted to create their own shows. Their first show, Edward Albee's *The Zoo Story*, was a success, and ever since then they have been growing and creating new and exciting shows in unconventional theatre spaces.

ITSAZOO received the award of 'Best New Play' in Victoria's 2007 Critic's Choice Awards and Monday Magazine 'M' Awards for *Grimm Tales* written by playwright in residence **Sebastien Archibald**. This show was so successful that ITSAZOO remounted it in 2008 at Mount Douglas Park in Victoria and Queen Elizabeth Park in Vancouver. While ITSAZOO will continue to perform in Victoria, they have permanently moved the company to Vancouver.

Speaking with ITSAZOO's General Manager and Director Chelsea Haberlin about their new show *Death of a Clown* by **Sebastien Archibald**, Haberlin spoke of why people should come to see the show as well as why this version is different than the previous two that Archibald wrote

Death of a Clown centres on Roy, a clown who wants to be successful and climb the corporate ladder. His problem lies in the fact that he's a clown and he can't climb that ladder because he's different. He meets many challenges and obstacles along the way, including boss' and doctors' that try to change him and make him something that he's not. All Roy wants is to be accepted, but as the show progresses it becomes obvious that that's impossible.

ITSAZOO has produced *Death of a Clown* once before, but never to this extent. This is **Archibald's** third incarnation of *Death of a Clown*, but it is without a doubt the most elaborate of the three versions. Various members of the cast are trained in clown, others are trained in movement. The cast incorporates clowning with a more Brechtian epic style of theatre which is a unique thing to see on stage. As Haberlin points out, "It's really exciting to see people with amazing talent come together on a project like this. And it's really exciting as a director to be able to find what they're great at and put it into a project."

Other exciting elements include a live clown band that underscores the show with instruments from flutes to accordions and recorders to pots and pans. There is also a video component where actors are seen "on location" at 'Rich Whites New Five Star Resort', one of the play's

development sites. This multi-media component incorporates an interesting element and creates a dynamic setting that isn't usually seen on the stage.

The set, designed by Kyle Sutherland, is essentially scaffolding that the actors can 'play' on, which adds an interesting element. Costume designer Meredith Canby has designed the entire show in black, white, and red. It is simple but elegant. It adds mystery and makes you pay attention to the meaning of the play rather than the design elements.

Why come see this show? It is a play unlike any you have ever seen before. Guaranteed that you have never seen a show like this. It will open your eyes to new possibilities in theatre and leave you wanting more. *Death of a Clown* also features a new playwright, new designers, and new actors from all over the lower mainland that you've probably never seen before. If you want to witness a new company in its early stages and see a play that will have you laughing from beginning to end, this is the show to come see this month.

The show runs from March 18th to March 28th. The 18th is perfect for students as it is a 'Pay-What-You-Can Preview'. Tickets are \$12 for anyone under 30 or Seniors /Students and \$15 for adults. 



2009 Pontiac Vibe


A student's everyday solution

ninspiring: unfortunately it's the first word that comes to mind when examining the 2009 Pontiac Vibe. Pretty much a tarted-up Toyota Matrix, it projects itself as a useable all-around car that comes with a kick-ass stereo and some bonus niceties – like a standard 3-prong 115 volt outlet for all your portable electronic charging needs.

The Vibe is a looker as hatches go and frankly, that's a good thing, because outside of its visual appeals, it's not the most thrilling car. Cockpit ingress is a surprisingly awkward maneuver in such a spacious ride (the back seat is huge, and totally comfortable for a full-sized adult or three). Once in place, the oddity of the ergonomics strikes home; you need abnormally short legs and really long arms to drive this car comfortably (I'm 6'1", taller than the average perhaps, but by no means pushing the envelope of expected positional flexibility). The standard telescopic and tilt steering wheel attempts to save the driving position some grace, but the feeling of disproportionate claustrophobia ruins the whole experience.

Once installed, a veritable sea of plastic, each piece cheaper and more "parts-bin" derived than the next, assaults the drivers' senses. While the use of metal and mahogany is not really expected in entry-level vehicles, there is no denying that this car is on the lower end of

A lot of it looks quite good – the instrument cluster is a beautiful piece with all kinds of exciting red and white lights and gauges – but it doesn't instill a feeling of build quality. One would hope it's all a ploy to encourage optioning, but further inspection of the bonus list reveals that a leather-wrapped steering wheel is really the only escape from base-level interior specification.

Don't get me wrong: there are upsides to the car of course. Trunk/cargo space is massive, with 1399 liters

(49.4 cu. Ft.) of emptiness once the flat-folding 60/40 split rear seats are put down. The plastic theme is continued in the cargo area, this time to the owners benefit, as you could essentially hose out the trunk. Also, grocery bag hooks and baby seat fastening points abound for when/if you decide to knowingly procreate. All in all, the car seems very well positioned toward anyone needing a general ride around the city, with the potential of carrying just about anything, from several babies to a couple of muddy bicycles.

Mechanically, the Vibe is good. The front wheel drive base model enters the market with a 1.8-liter 4 cylinder,

132bhp motor. The all wheel drive (AWD) – automatic transmission only – and the GT versions heat things up with a 2.4-liter lump that produces 158 bhp. Again, the engines are directly pulled from the Toyota lineup, and feature that company's patented Variable Valve Timing-intelligence (VVT-i), a proven engine management system. The torsion beam front and independent rear suspension, coupled with GM's Stabilitrak traction control system and all-around ABS disc brakes, make for a nice drive, with good composure at speed over broken pavement. The only minor niggles were the somewhat severe jarring from big-

ger obstacles like parking lot speed-bumps – perhaps a case of the cargo-supporting rear suspension being a little stiffly sprung for everyday empty car driving – and the fact that taller drivers' 2 o'clock vision will suffer with the mammoth rearview mirror.

What it comes down to then, is that the Vibe simply does a decent job of doing what it's designed to do. The base model asking price is a little steep at \$16,830, but don't necessarily jump at the GT either: you'll be out over \$26,000. Yes, if nothing else, shoot for a middle-of-theroad model, and you'll soon discover that the pricing structure epitomizes the car: the Vibe is a happy medium vehicle that'll run you around the city during your student years, and maybe even usher you into "adulthood". Don't buy this one for the long haul though; the bang for buck value just isn't there.
