

Campus Renewal

Connector Building construction to begin early February

onstruction of a \$3.4 million engineering technology building will begin this February as part of the on-going development of the campus master plan.

The recently released architectural designs show the building linking SW1 and SW3 in an innovative 45 degree rotation disrupting the typical rectangular block or the existing core grid. The result will be a clearly identifiable home for the School of Engineering Technology and its parttime studies program.

The three-story, 2100-square metre building will house about 136 faculty and support staff and will include seminar rooms, meeting rooms and an orientation lobby.

There are a number of features staff will enjoy. The building contains an interior courtyard providing light and air for interior offices. Each office has opening windows providing a non-sealed environment. The building will exceed the B.C. Building Code for disabled access.

B. James Wensley Architect Ltd. designed the building and the tender deadline to select the general contractor is January 28. Completion of the building is estimated by this November 30.
