1992. She is a vice president of the B.C. Federation of Labour (BCFed), Since 1988 she has represented 16,000 federal public service employees in British Columbia as a national director for the Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC). She has worked in the federal public sector in the fields of community development, immigration and labour market training and is a director of the Working Opportunity Fund.

# **IBM** Building Opens

Numerous donors invested in future BCIT graduates. Substantial financial support came from MacMillan Bloedel, BC Tel, Chevron Canada, Weldwood of Canada and Westcoast Energy, and their generosity was matched by a provincial government fund.

# Hey, don't forget to change your voice mail greeting

For instructors away from BCIT this summer, here are some suggestions for voice mail messages.

a)During your vacation period you can leave an Extended Absence voice message.

- 1 Dial into Octel (6777) or (451-6777)
- 2 Press 4 for "Personal Options"
- 3 Press 3 for "Greetings"
- 4 Press 2 for "Extended Absence Message"
- 5 Follow the prompts to record message

Suggested phone message during vacation:

Hi, you have reached (your name) from BCIT's (xyz) program. I am not available but will be in the office from (date) to (date). If you would like to call me back during that time, I would be happy to speak with you. You can also press "0" and ask the switchboard to transfer you to the person on duty for this program.

#### b)For instructors, during your duty period you can leave an Extended Absence voice message.

- 1 Dial into Octel (6777) or (451-6777)
- 2 Press 4 for "Personal Options"
- 3 Press 3 for "Greetings"
- 4 Press 1 for "Personal Greeting"
- 5 Follow the prompts to record message

Hi, you have reached (your name) from BCIT's (xyz) program. It is (date) and I will be on duty from (date) to (date). Please leave a detailed message including your phone number and I will get back to you as soon as possible.
