



THE CRAMMING BEGINS

New SA executive elected

The voting is over and a new executive elect is poised to take over the running of the Student Association following the elections held April 17 through 19.

The most hotly contested position on the executive was that of vice president of Finance and Administration. Penelope Henriques, who gained 213 votes beat out

Christopher Thomas' 196 by 17 votes.

The other executive position races were more clear cut in their results.

For vice president of Public Relations and Marketing Claire Carlos was elected over Priscilla Nunez 445 to 189 and for Campus Life coordinator Michelle Matsuo won over Aviva abramovich 383 to 254.

Brent Morris was elected as Business and Health Chair with 312 votes defeating Ryan Benn who gained 243 votes.

Nick Will was elected as Chair of Manufacturing, Mechanical & Processing, Energy & Natural Resources with 22 votes. He beat out Ben Rauscher, Roman Sedlack and Dan Cindric.

Two candidates running without opposition, Brian MacNeil and Linda Lee as president and vice president of Student Affairs respectively, received the students' nod.

Three positions remain

vacant on the SA executive. The Electrical, Electronics and Computer Information Chair, and the Transportation & Construction Chair, for which no candidates presented themselves will be elected in another election in September and a Trades Chair is still to be appointed by council.

Turnout for the elections was poorer than in recent years with the largest turnout being students in the Schools of Business and Health Sciences.

SA passes new budget

The Student Association budget was presented and passed with little discussion. Some executives questioned the losses in the copy center and in certain TnT outposts. These losses were explained by the need for maintaining service levels for students over the need to make a profit. Some additional services will be available in the up-coming year, such as a copier in the SW1 foyer.

Yvonne Hustins, SA Financial Manager, will be retiring in exactly 59 days, responded to some of the executives questions regarding contracts for space on campus by saying "we don't get nothing for free." The SA did present a balanced budget and the budget was accepted unanimously, with two abstentions coming from the SA councilors. There were few major budgetary issues to be discussed.

 Roman Sedlack made a small mention to bring SA members up-to-date with the status of the BCIT President Selection committee. The coming week will bring two selection committee meetings, where they will interview the four finalist candidates. The committee will spend a half a day with each of the finalist. In addition, they will review the late applications for any potentially viable candidates.

any potentially viable candidates.

The committee will conclude the selection process after an additional week where they will have follow-up interviews with the finalists, then they will make a recommendation on three candidates and the administration will select one from the group of three recommended.

- The new BCIT one card, a unified student ID card, copy card, print card, was included in the SA council meeting discussions again this week. The old auto insurance office, near the great hell, will be transformed into the one card head quarters, new students will begin having their photos taken there for their cards next year. SA Executive Director, Stephen Miller, responded to executive's queries regarding the functionality of the new card by stating "We believe the new card will be good for the students, however, the proof is in the pudding, and we'll see how the students react in the coming year."
- SA Executive Director, Stephen Miller, pointed out to the executives and councilors at this weeks meeting that there has been no valedictorian selected for the graduating class this year, he suggested that any student interested in being valedictorian apply. Because a suitable candidate has not been found, the deadline for applying for the valedictorian honors at BCIT has been extended to May 5, 2000.


Now, I'm not saying that there is no substance to this performer, I'm just pointing out what it is that makes seeing Beck more sensational than seeing any one of the other millions of bands that are out their, it's a real pop culture event.

The music is brilliant, when Beck first came onto the scene his style was described as something like 90's folk-rock, alternative folk-rock, retard rock, whatever. Through the years

he's gone from "I'm a loser baby" complimented by abstract lyrical nonsense, to playing the top musical award shows with more hip hop inspired tracks like "two turn tables and a microphone". The show displayed all the diversity of Beck's talent, any star who manages to stay on top in the American (split-second attention span) culture for so long has got to be able to dig deep for something new.

All Beck's albums have kept some anti-commercial slant, including tracks with so much feedback and noise that it makes it impossible for any commercial radio station to play it without the chance of giving some of the more conventional listeners a heart attack. For this, I respect Beck and his music, and his "I don't give a shit" attitude. Maybe this is just some angle used to sell albums but I think listening to his albums inspires some people to take a little of that "I don't give shit" attitude home and laugh at the irony that can exist in this "you must fit in" society.



Dot Allison Afterglow Arista / BMG

Afterglow is some where in between the cutting edge, out-there-on-the-fringes style and the mainstream, mollified version.


It has all the elements of a style of music that can only be found by being part of a deep underground musical movement, like drum n' bass, trance, etc. yet some how it's tried to squeeze it into the contemporary song structure, you know: intro, chorus, verse one, chorus, verse two etc.,

Many musical forms and styles lose a lot of their original appeal when it is transformed to a version that is radio friendly, I'm not saying that Dot Allison's Afterglow is an example of this, but it is one step along the way towards taking a style that originated on the fringes and converting it to a consumer-friendly version.

Personally, I like Afterglow, some songs breakdown at points, but I like the music and the genre. The problem comes when the music tries more to be a song rather than just flowing it's natural course. This style of music lends itself more to a longer, unstructured flow, rather than a song structure between two and five minutes long, with a beginning and an end, designed to be a vehicle for the artist, rather than a showcase for the music itself. This album has a lot of the sounds and feels of the style that bore it, but it has been modified to fit your screen.




Love makes the world go round, but ...

Is there a way to reduce my Student Loan debt? Yes! There's loan remission.

That is the loan remission program? The official answer is "the British Columbia loan remission program is designed to help reduce your British Columbia Student Loan debt to a more manageable level upon graduation", in other words, if you graduated and are aware enough to know what's going on, you can catch a break on your student loan payments.

The facts you need to know are:

- · You must successfully complete your program in order to be eligible for the loan remission program.
- You must uestions complete your program in a timely manor, that is if the program is two years you must complete it in the two years plus a grace period of one educational year.
- · You have one year after graduating (your study period end date) to apply for the loan remission, that's one year after you graduate to apply, this is the deadline.
- You cannot apply until after you graduate.
- · There is a requirement called Personal Responsibility, i.e. during each four month period before classes start you must

have been involved in one of the specified activities such as: working, volunteering, studying etc. as stipulated by the eligibility criteria in the loan remission application.

These are the general rules to follow if you want to successfully apply for the loan remission, however, there are exceptions to every rule, and in this case there are many exceptions. For example, if you have defaulted loans in the past the application process will and guidelines will vary in our circumstances. You will have

to examine the application and your own history to deter-

mine if you are eligible and what steps you will have to take to apply.

anv case, until have vou received some CARLOS ASSUNCAO sort of notifica-

tion regarding the status of your loan remission application, you are required to make monthly payments as per the agreement set by the bank/credit union in the case of your individual student loan.

One thing to keep in mind if your graduating this May, the first thing you should do is contact your bank and make arrangements regarding your loan, if you don't it's possible the bank will make assumptions regarding your status as a student and the payments which are required of you.

You can pick up a loan remission application at the financial services desk in SW1 on the BCIT Burnaby campus.
