# And the winners are...



Carol Borghesi receives her Alumni Association Achievement Award for her contributions to the BCIT community.

The Alumni Association has a long tradition of honoring Alumni and individuals.

Carol Borghesi was awarded the Alumni Associaton Achievement Award. The recipient of this award must be a BCIT graduate who demonstrates outstanding performance in one or more areas of technical, business achievement, career development, community affairs or service in government.

A 1981 International Marketing graduate, Borghesi has been listed in the Financial Post's "Top 40 under 40 Canadian Superachievers". Borghesi's firsts include being the first female sales manager in BC TEL's company history, the first woman under age 36 to be appointed to a director-level position, the first woman to be given responsibility for a business unit at BC TEL and the first female to be named Marketing Executive of the Year in the 50-year history of the Sales and Marketing Executives of Vancouver.

Borghesi was VP and General Manager for BC TEL Mobility and is now working for British Telecom in London, England. Borghesi has been a strong supporter of BCIT — in 1996 she was the first speaker of the BCIT-AMA Women in Motion Speaker series and has been a mentor for many students. Borghesi shared her BCIT experience in a liftnote to raise funds in this year's Annual Alumni Campaign.

Dr. Donald Rix received the Alumni Association Award for his substantial contribution to the well-being of the community. Through perseverance and dedication he has worked to ensure BCIT will stand out as a learning institute.

Dr. Rix has demonstrated a longterm commitment to BCIT through his participation in various committees including the BCIT Development Council, Medical Laboratory Advisory Committee, BCIT Board of Governors and as co-chair of BCIT's President's Club.

The Rix family is well-known for their tremendous generosity in providing endowment funds for various student awards, the establishment of the Rix Club and donations of equipment to the campus. They recently made a generous and unique "planned gift" to BCIT which will continue to enhance endowment funds for student awards and to assist in the creation of the Dr. Tong Louie Living Laboratory located at the Downtown Campus.

Clayton McKinley, Vice President of Finance and Administration, and Marshall Heinekey, Coordinator of Special Projects, were also presented with Alumni Association Awards. McKinley and Heinekey received accolades for their integral roles in making the dream of a BCIT Downtown campus a reality. As members of the project steering committee, they successfully managed the project: on schedule, on budget and with private funding; they have ensured a prominent place for BCIT in the heart of Vancouver as an outstanding learning institute for the 21st century.

# Grad finds himself in another institute

#### William H. T. Norris, Business Management, Administration graduate, 1968

Coming from a family of four, Bill Norris started at BCIT in 1965. In his first year, Bill found that the programs require more than full-time dedication and scarce time for socializing. A dedicated self-starter, Bill returned in 1966 to begin a very positive post-secondary experience.

Bill says the combination of practical and academic work at BCIT teaches people to be dedicated in the face of a challenge.

"BCIT grads are doers: they can take a vision and make it happen," he says.

After graduation, Bill joined the Sears' management trainee program and began working his way up the middle management ladder. During the program Bill realized the value of his training at BCIT and the importance of finding and cultivating career and life mentors.

In 1983, Bill and his wife, Carolyn, started a family, and now have two beautiful children. Three years later he received a promotion at Sears to a national-level assignment and the family moved to Toronto. In 1990 they returned to the west and Bill accepted his current position as Personnel Director at Trinity Western University.

Over the past eight years, Bill has overseen a growth of 150 staff members.

"BCIT training prepared me well for the challenge of the steep learning curve of a career change," he says.

Bill is also busy outside of his career: he raced sports cars from 1968 to 1983, winning four national championships as a team member and a B.C. 'Spring Series' Sedan Championship in 1975.

He has helped to establish a church in Langley and remains very involved in Christian activities. Bill has a passion for reading and spent his Saturday mornings for two years reading books onto tape for the blind at the Crane Resource Centre. He enjoys reading, walking, and spending time in family activities.

#### Michael J. Barrett, Biomedical Engineering instructor, 1967 Electronics graduate

What were you doing prior to becoming a student at BCIT? Yikes! That was a long time ago. I was studying physics at UBC and

supporting myself through school by working as a landscaper, cook and commercial fisherman.

### Why did you choose to do your studies here?

A senior astronomer told me that getting a technical diploma in electronics would guarantee jobs in the field while studying astrophysics. BCIT had just opened and seemed to offer an equivalent program to Ryerson without the move to Ontario. The jobs were so good that my astronomy career got sidetracked for 14 years.

# What did you do upon graduation? When did you graduate?

Northern Electric Co. (Now NORTEL) in Montreal hired me as a systems application engineer. We worked on the first digital switching systems for telephones. My special area included the military telephone network that

serviced the "RED TELEPHONE" connecting Washington and Moscow.

#### What's it like to teach at BCIT?

Very busy. BCIT students work very hard for long hours — it is a chore to keep ahead of them and to keep their interests up.

### What are you doing with the Web site?

I've had an interest in building Web sites for some time. Frustrated by BCIT's lack of Web presence, we launched the Biomedical Web site with information about courses, faculty e-mail addresses and a forum for graduates to maintain their contacts. We have evolved into a Biomedical Department Web site of news, opinion and contact information for students, colleagues and graduates. We feature a job listing page and hope to have a new page up shortly listing all our graduates from year one to the present.

# Granting degrees for the real world



Diploma graduates demanding upgrading and career advancement opportunities have been advocates for a technological degree in British Columbia for more than two decades. In January 1995 legislation was passed enabling BCIT to confer Bachelor of Technology degrees.

#### What does it look like?

The model of BCIT's Bachelor of Technology degree reflects the two major requirements identified by alumni: full credit for their diploma and accessibility for working adults.

#### The Model

- Diploma of Technology
- Two years relevant work experience
- Advanced technical specialties including practicum (39 credits)
- Management studies (9 credits)
- Liberal education studies (12 credits)

The Bachelor of Technology degree is more aptly described as a degree completion program; it builds on the diploma, which constitutes the first two years of the degree. It is offered on a part-time basis and, in some cases, by distance education to accommodate those constrained by work schedules or geographic location. The mandatory two-year work experience prior to advanced studies both reinforces the practical focus of the degree and enhances the

student's educational experience of degree level studies. The curriculum includes three distinct categories:

- Advanced technical specialty courses promote currency in a given area; the industry-based practicum involves students in applied research in a real world situation.
- Management studies enhance employability skills and promotional opportunities.
- Liberal studies increase competence in dealing with increasingly complex social and ethical issues.

Is it a University Degree?

The Bachelor of Technology is of equal merit but different from a university degree. It retains academic rigor, but stresses practical applications of knowledge. BCIT's Bachelor of Technology degree now provides an alternate path to degree-level studies. The degree differs from a university degree in the following ways:

- The Bachelor of Technology is designed as a career advancement opportunity rather than a jobentry credential.
- The curriculum reflects industry input and is driven by workplace needs rather than by academic bias.

♦ Compared to a university degree, the Bachelor of Technology appears "upside down".

University studies traditionally begin with a wide range of subjects specializing progressively each year. The Bachelor of Technology degree model requires a narrower specialist focus in the first two years to ensure technical competence at the diploma level and a broadening of knowledge through inclusion of management and liberal studies in the later years.

## How do I know it's a "real" degree?

All new degrees in British Columbia, whether from a university, a university college or provincial institute, are validated by the same provincial committee to ensure consistency of standards. Prior to this, BCIT degrees undergo a rigorous internal Quality Assurance process where they are scrutinized by educators, internal and external to BCIT, and by industry representatives. BCIT's Bachelor of Technology degrees must satisfy two overarching criteria: they must be educationally sound, and they must meet the needs of industry.

#### What degrees is BCIT offering?

BCIT only offers degrees in areas where there is a demonstrated

market need. Degrees currently offered are:

- Computer Systems
- Environmental Engineering Technology
- Accounting
- Medical Imaging
- Environmental Health
- Specialty Nursing

It is anticipated that the following degrees, currently under development, will be offered as indicated, subject to Ministry approval:

- Manufacturing intended implementation January 1998
- Management intended implementation September 1998
- Construction Management intended implementation September 1998
- Geomatics intended implementation September 1998
- Electrical/Electronics intended implementation September 1998

# Letter to another editor

Reprinted from the Burnaby Now, Sept. 3, 1997 Editor,

As a BCIT graduate I feel compelled to respond to an ad Capilano College placed in your newspaper Aug. 10. It solicited full-time enrolment by comparing tuition fees, average class sizes and instructors. Unfortunately, the ad contained some untruths I would like to address

In comparing tuition, the ad gives a tuition figure of \$2,480 for BCIT and \$1,832 for Capilano College. What it fails to point out is that the BCIT figure quoted is for a full-year program of 15 courses. The Capilano College figure quoted is for a full-year program of 10 courses. So for just \$400 more at BCIT you would get five extra courses!

Comparing average class sizes, the Capilano ad gives a figure of 50 at BCIT and 36 at Capilano. Since all my classes were never larger than

25 students, I called BCIT to find the average class size at BCIT is 23 students per class. That's 13 students less than Capilano College's

Finally, the ad questions whether BCIT has instructors with business experience. All of my instructors certainly did! In fact, one of the main reasons I chose BCIT as my educational institute was to be able to learn from instructors with realworld, job-ready skills.

As a marketing graduate, I understand the value of competitive advertising as a marketing tool - but when making comparisons the correct information is essential. This whole experience leads me to ask: If a Capilano College advertisement is portraying false and misleading information, then what of the content in the courses they offer?


