President's message

I would like to take this opportunity to let you know how the BCIT Alumni Association is organized and how it represents you at BCIT.

The Board of Directors of the BCIT Alumni Association is comprised of: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, two representatives from Business, two representatives from Engineering, and two representatives from Health. In addition, alumni members are appointed or elected to many committees, boards and councils which influence the daily activities of BCIT.

To give you an idea of where you are represented, listed below are some of the Alumni positions at BCIT:

The Board of Governors: One 1-year position elected annually in April. Educational Council: Three 2-year positions elected bi-annually in May (one from each division), and one ex-officio position - The President of the Alumni Association. Technology Advisory Committees: One alumnus member appointed to each committee.

One of our priorities in the coming six months is to increase our alumni memberships and establish for the first time ever an accurate set of Alumni Records. This is the starting point for a successful Alumni Association - without knowing who you are and where you are we cannot work for you.

There are many issues of concern for BCIT in the coming decade. Governments will be less generous than before with their grants. Our association has an important role to play in this process. It is imperative that alumni become more familiar with BCIT's problems and its future destiny. It is also important that the institute listens to its alumni in order that its decisions reflect the true needs of the student, both full time and part time.
