#### **Accolades and Accomplishments**



#### WHAT I DID ON MY SUMMER HOLIDAYS

They say a change is as good as a rest - and that proved the case for my summer in Dawson City, Yukon Territories. From having spent the last 13 years in Nursing — I was alternately a prep cook, souvenir sales clerk, bar waitress, busperson and hotel housekeeper. It sounds stressful but the variety and novelty of it all proved very relaxing. I discovered a whole new language; some examples -"gorbie" (tourist), "tarbender" (bartender), "housecreeper" (housekeeper) and "dish pig" (that's the person who washes all those dishes you dirty in a restaurant).

Dawson City is a sleepy little town of 1,500 people that mushrooms to 3,000 people to service the tourist (50,000 visitors) and mining industry May thru October. Everyone is friendly

and cooperative — it's a town where people share their talents and energy for the common good. Once it became known that I was a nurse my days also included on the spot consultations and treatment. With no veterinarian in town I was also involved in several diagnoses and treatments of the town pets.

In a land where the sun truly does shine 24 hours of the day, and the summer month of July boasts 85-90° temperatures, the Yukon provides an excellent vacation destination. The scenery is magnificent, local history alive and the unique feeling of the North really does change a person.

#### EDUCATIONAL LEAVE FUND INCREASED




