Twenty years ago a ceremony was held to celebrate the opening of BCIT, hailed in one local newspaper as, "A monument to technology," and "An educational first".

It was mild and sunny on October 5, 1964, the day Premier W.A.C. Bennett performed the opening ceremonies — nearly four years after the provincial government had announced plans to build the \$7m. facility. The news began to spread about the exciting new employment opportunities that would be available to students with two years of technology training from BCIT. Since then 20,000 students have passed through BCIT's doors on their way to careers in the fields of engineering technology, health sciences and business management, and many thousands more have taken part-time courses.

Today, we are celebrating that twenty years of growth by re-enacting the original opening ceremony. We are honoured to have as our guests some of the original participants and others who have contributed to our success over the years.
