STUDENTS TALK TO PREMIER ABOUT BUDGET CUT

At 9 a.m. on Friday, April 22 a small delegation of BCIT student representatives met with Premier Bill Vander Zalm at his downtown office to express their feelings of dismay at the impending budget cut. The 40-minute meeting, according to incoming Student Association president, Guy Steeves, was very positive and ended with Vander Zalm agreeing to make a public declaration of support for BCIT in front of the news media.

During the meeting with Steeves, S.A. president, Jamie Letwin and S.A. business manager and BCIT grad Lorne Hildebrand, the Premier said he may have received some misinformation about the Institute and wanted to review the situation, Steeves said.

"After listening to us list BCIT's merits and assets, he said that if after reviewing the Institute's revised budget the Ministry was dissatisfied with the funding, he was prepared to go to bat with the Treasury Board. He also said that whatever direction the Institute ended up taking, he wanted to make sure it was the best institute in the West!"

Premier Vander Zalm was due to visit the BCIT campus last week.

KYLE WINS AGAIN

For the second year running, dean of the School of Business, John Kyle, has placed first in the Professional Photographers Association of B.C.'s annual print competition.

Kyle, who has only belonged to the exclusive association for two years, won for a picture of his Persian cat Sashi, entered in the animal category. Last year he placed first in the pictorial category for his picture, "Fogbound".

Working out of his studio on West Third, Kyle uses a Mamiya RV67 to produce high key portraits of his famiy and friends. The technique uses a white background to emphasize the subject. A portrait of Pat Fingarson's 18 year old daughter Wendy, for instance, is a study of the beauty and freshness of youth. Another, of BCIT secretary Lexi Leeson with her baby, captures the softness and purity of mother and child. Kyle has also taken pictures of students from Broadcast and Transporation and Distribution Management for their portfolios. His wife Wenda, who is a professional make-up artist, does the photo retouching.

Kyle loves taking pictures but says lack of time prevents him from taking on more than a few assignments now and then.

INSTRUCTOR LOOKS AT BCIT STRESS LEVELS

With stress at its present level, a timely study is being conducted on how BCIT faculty copes with stress at the Institute. The study forms part of an M.A. thesis being conducted by Communication Department instructor Eileen Stephens who says that while numerous studies have examined stress in an educational setting, few have dealt with it in the context of higher education. Dr. Bonita Long of the UBC Counselling Psychology Department is Stephens' co-researcher on the project.

"We will investigate not only the ways individuals in the BCIT environment deal with stressful events, but also how the environment affects levels of stress and individual reactions to it," says Stephens. She is currently distributing a questionnaire to a sample of 250 BCIT faculty members.

Summaries of the findings will be mailed to questionnaire respondents and will also be available to faculty through their management or union representatives. If you receive one of Eileen's questionnaires, please complete it (without giving your name) and return it to the Staff Society Office or to Terry Fletcher, chairman of the BCGEU bargaining unit. The questionnaire takes approximately 45 minutes to complete.

HEALTH AND SAFETY PROBLEMS ADDRESSED BY BCIT COMMITTEE

Have you ever tripped over a loose piece of carpet, smelt what you think are noxious fumes, or had trouble getting sufficient lighting for your work area? According to a recent Workers' Compensation Board survey, most employees at BCIT are unaware that there is a group of people on campus willing and able to tackle such problems: **the Health and Safety Committee**.

Composed of staff and faculty from across the campus, the committee meets on the second Wednesday of each month from 9 to 11 a.m., then usually sets off to conduct safety inspections. However, if you have a question or spot a potential hazard, you don't have to wait for the committee to meet. Simply check the list (see over) to find your local representative and give him or her a call. The question or problem could be taken care of very quickly.
