


J.W. INGLIS

BURNABY VOCATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOOL CREST



The school's crest shown above gives an indication of the philosophy of the School.

The interpretation of the crest is the harnessing of the wilds (chained cougar), of British Columbia (Dogwood Blossom), and of Canada (Maple Leaf) by brainpower and skill (Animo et Arte).
