

Educational Council holds first meeting

MEMBERS OF THE NEW EDUCATIONAL COUNCIL ELECTED AN INTERM CHAIRPERSON AND VICE CHAIRPERSON AT THEIR FIRST MEETING ON MAY 12. PETER JONES AND GENE SHKURHAN, RESPECTIVELY, WERE ELECTED TO HOLD THE POSITIONS ON AN INTERIM BASIS UNTIL TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR COUNCIL HAVE BEEN WORKED OUT.

In opening the first session, President Murray stressed the importance of identifying what Council's role would be, especially in relation to other committees and organized groups on campus. He said Council should be concerned with educational policy matters and not the fine details of curriculum which would be up to the individual school Councils.

Educational policy will be drafted by the Educational Committee under V.P. Education, Drug Svetic and sent to Educational Council for review.

Council, said Murray, must measure the pulse of the Institute to see whether the academic direction being taken is the right one and they should develop an academic plan to support the institute's Mission Statement.

A small committee was struck to draft terms of reference for Educational Council and these will be discussed at the next meeting on May 26.

DEAN OF THE SCHOOL OF CONSTRUCTION AND NATURAL RESOURCE STUDIES, RON HYDE, HAS BEEN AWARDED HONOURARY MEMBERSHIP IN THE ASSOCIATION OF THE APPLIED SCIENCE TECHNOLOGISTS AND TECHNICIANS OF B.C.

The presentation was made by ASTTBC president, Arthur G. Sanderson during the association's A.G.M. at Whistler on April 25.

Hyde's involvement with ASTT goes back to the mid 1970's when he successfully applied for formal recognition and accreditation of Biological Sciences graduates. He has also served as a member of the ASTT Accreditation Board and Board of Examiners.

In presenting the honorary membership, Arthur Sanderson said:

"In 28 years our association has awarded only 23 honorary membership certificates...you could say that we have a very high regard for the individuals nominated to receive one.

"In addition to his contribution to technological education as an instructor and manager at BCIT, Ron has made an important contribution to the growth and development of our association."

Ron Hyde was among the former BCIT's first staff members when it opened in 1964.
