Intelligent Microgrids: BCIT's Power Saving Innovation

BCIT received funding from BC's Innovative Clean Energy Fund and sponsorship from BC Hydro to set up BC's first intelligent electricity microgrid within the Burnaby campus. This new research project, led by the Group for Advanced Information Technology at the BCIT Technology Centre, The initial phase of the project includes installing smart meters, sensors, and controls on campus. A web-based Energy Management System will monitor these devices, enabling active management of power by helping to time demand cycles to coincide with off-peak resources. focuses on developing solutions to automate the current electrical power grid and build a smarter, more secure power grid. An intelligent grid will allow power devices to communicate through a central system, making "smart" decisions to optimize power distribution and transmission. The intelligent grid will help to balance power generation with demand, reducing the potential for blackouts. It will also be able to integrate current energy sources such as hydro or natural gas with alternative energy sources such as biomass, solar, and wind plants.



utilities project will contribute to research and development of energy sector technologies capable of telling us when the cheapest or cleanest power is available. These advances will make it easier for us to change our household energy consumption patterns to reduce our costs and our carbon footprint.

One of the research streams is currently investigating ways to provide feedback to consumers to make educated and informed choices about how and when they use electricity at home and at work. A pilot study will use data collected from meters installed on each of the Maquinna Residence houses, and will enable students to track, measure, and to compare their electrical consumption patterns through an inter-house competition. From nuclear medicine to wine making

ONE GRAD'S JOURNEY



For Lanny Martinuk, his work is an absolute passion for perfection, comprised of elements of both art and science. Lanny and his family own and operate Stoneboat Vineyards, 50 acres nestled on the hills of the South Okanagan Lower Black Sage Bench in Oliver, BC. Stoneboat specializes in premium varieties of the Pinot grape, which they use to produce award-winning wines such as their Pinot Noir and Pinotage. While dabbling in winemaking sounds like a great gig, it requires a lot of hard work, persistence, and painstaking attention to detail. Just ask Lanny, who started the winery after growing experimental grape varieties during the 1980s for Brights Wine, which went on to become the province's largest wine producer, Vincor. He became a founding member of the BC Wine Institute, which now has 88 member wineries and grape producers, accounting for 95% of wine production in the province.

Lanny attributes his success to really loving what he does—farming. He credits his ability to produce a consistently premium wine product to the accuracy methods that he obtained through his training in BCIT's Nuclear Medicine program, from which he graduated in 1976. At the time, he and his wife Julie were living in Burnaby and working in Vancouver, but they weren't happy living in the city. Julie was originally from the Okanagan and suggested they change their lifestyle with a move to a 15-acre mixed orchard in the Okanagan Valley. After several years of harvesting apples, grapes and other fruits, the market dropped after free trade took effect, and Lanny decided to make the complete move to grapes after his neighbours replanted their orchard with vines. He's never looked back, and he couldn't be happier. Says Lanny, "30 years later, it is amazing how much I still use my training from BCIT. The chemistry and specific scientific methods related to propagation and the chemical analysis of wine are still as relevant today as they were back then."

BCIT grad makes a difference to Afghan orphans

BCIT Broadcast and Media Communications – Radio grad Natalie Carney is in Afghanistan working on a documentary about the orphans of the war-torn country. Natalie, who currently lives in Dubai, spent the month of September

Natalie is staying at the Mehan orphanage in Kabul, from which she regularly posts video blogs detailing various aspects of her Afghan experience. Often she is joined on screen by girls from the orphanage, and there is an

visiting orphanages, conducting interviews, and gathering footage for the documentary, *Forgotten Victims*. Through the words and actions of Afghan orphans, Natalie hopes "to be able to capture the essence of these children, who live such different lives than the ones we know."

Natalie first visited Afghanistan last year, when she needed to escape "the materialistic, superficial environment [Dubai] offers" she says. Kabul seemed to Natalie to be the opposite extreme, and when a friend suggested she bring over some old clothing for an orphanage there, she "contacted an orphanage online, collected five suitcases worth from myself, friends and colleagues and headed over."

Another visit a year later convinced her that Afghanistan "is not that scary place" depicted by news networks, she says. "There are some absolutely terrific people amongst [the poverty, fighting and suffering] living very comfortable, happy lives. I was fortunate enough to meet many of them." obvious affection between them. Her video blogs take the viewer into the streets of Kabul, behind the scenes at the city's orphanages, and into the lives of average Afghan citizens.

"I hope to achieve something positive for the country with this documentary," says Natalie. "Whether it's sponsorship for another orphan or simply that someone may open their mind more to the lovely aspects of Afghanistan and its people."

In the meantime, she says, "I am thoroughly enjoying my time around people who take nothing for granted and appreciate every moment of life for what it is!"

In Memoriam

The Alumni Association Remembers

Dr. Donald Rix



On Nov. 6, philanthropist, physician and visionary entrepreneur, Dr. Donald Rix, passed away at the age of 78.

Don Rix was a truly inspiring Canadian. As Chairman and President of former MetroLabs (now

LifeLabs), he grew Cantest from a small company to a leading-edge testing facility. He held orders of BC and Canada and was the recipient of numerous prestigious awards. Don was the recipient of many honorary doctorate degrees, including BCIT's Doctorate of Technology.

Don's positive influence on the institute is something from which we have all benefited and continue to benefit. One of the most visible legacies of many his contributions to BCIT comes in the form of The Rix Club, used daily by faculty, staff, and students, to which Don and his wife Eleanor contributed \$90,000 in 1991.

In 1994, Don established The Rix Family Endowment. The annual income is used to provide bursaries to second-year Health Sciences students in financial need. Don upgraded his endowment continually, and it is now one of the largest at BCIT with a value in excess of \$740,000.

Don also made significant contributions from 1997 to 2000 to establish the Tong Louie Living Lab at BCIT's Downtown Campus. The lab, named after the late Dr. Tong Louie, is a unique applied research facility in North America. The lab's mandate is to facilitate better, independent, and safer lives for older adults, persons with disabilities, and healthcare workers through the creation and evaluation of effective assistive and medical devices, consumer products, technologies, and environments.

Don was a founding member of the BCIT Foundation Board of Directors in 1999 and, prior to that, was a member of its predecessor the BCIT Development Council. He was also a member of the BCIT Board of Governors in the early 1980s.

He continually supported BCIT both financially and through his participation on a variety of boards and in a number of committees. With his passing, we are honoured to have such a legacy of support from him over the past 30 years. In remembrance BCIT lowered its flags to half-mast on November 18th, the day of his memorial service.

If you were perusing the paper over the Thanksgiving weekend, you may have read of Bernie Ratsoy's passing following a lengthy illness. Many of you, particularly in BSN and Specialty Nursing programs, will have known Bernie in her capacity as either a provincial healthcare leader and/or as Associate Dean in the BCIT School of Health Sciences. She made a tremendous positive impact on the nursing profession at both the provincial and national level.

Bernie's legacy at BCIT includes the advancement of nursing to a BSN degree and the advancement and recognition of BCIT's Specialty Nursing certificates and degree. She also set the stage for considerable innovation in other program areas — always with a central passion about quality patient care through sound post-secondary education.
