The school's crest shown above gives an indication of the philosophy of the School.







# OBJECTIVES:

To train citizens of British Columbia for entry into gainful employment in the Industries of the Province, and to increase the skills and efficiency of those persons already employed.

## TRAINING PROGRAMMES

- (a) Pre-Apprenticeship: This training is provided to those individuals desirous of entering a designated trade. By completing a Pre-Apprentice training programme an individual becomes more acceptable for employment as an apprentice.
- (b) Apprenticeship: This training is provided for those individuals who have been indentured as apprentices and are required to return to school to receive instruction in those phases of their work that are difficult to teach "on the job".
- (c) Pre-Employment: This training is provided for those individuals who are not able to qualify under the Pre-Apprenticeship plan. It is designed to prepare individuals for entry into the skilled work areas of industry.
- (d) Upgrading or Trade Extension: This training is provided for those individuals who having completed journeyman requirements and have been working at their respective trades for some time, find it necessary to take training in special areas of the work in which they may be deficient. This upgrading of skills and knowledge will of course make the individual more employable.

Willingdon Avenue Plastering ..... Exhibition Park Plumbing and Steamfitting ..... Willingdon Avenue Sheet Metalwork .... Willingdon Avenue Welding ..... Willingdon Avenue

Length of Courses vary from six months to two years depending on type of course.

# AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS

The success of any Vocational Training Programme is dependent upon the close co-operation of all agencies interested in the development of a skilled labour force.

# Apprenticeship Branch, Department of Labour

All training programmes in the designated trade areas are offered with the full financial support and co-operation of the Apprenticeship Branch, Department of Labour of the Province of British Columbia. All Pre-Apprentice and Apprentice training programmes are organized by the Apprenticeship Branch which administers the Apprenticeship Act for the Province.

# Advisory Committees

Committees, composed of representatives of management, labour, Apprenticeship Branch and Department of Education, are formed for all the programmes being offered in the School. It is the function of these committees to advise the School authorities on the course content of the programme being taught and to advise on the kind of training required by industry at large.
