Pickets are down, term extended

Part-time students returned to classes on Saturday, Nov. 13 and full-time Technology students on Monday, Nov. 15.

On Nov. 16, the Education Council and the Board of Governors passed two resolutions:

"For Part-time Studies courses, the disrupted class time will be made up by extending the term to two weeks, or by increasing the number of weekly contact hours by the normal course end date to retain the total number of hours for the course."

"For Full-time Technology programs, the lost instructional activities, learning activities, and learning outcomes will be made up by extending the term up to Dec. 17."

Other dates were modified as well. The last day to withdraw and receive a "W" on transcript for full term courses (except Electronics Technology, Nursing, and Technology Entry) is now Nov. 30 (formerly Nov. 9). For Nursing, the withdrawal date has been changed to Nov 19; for Electronics Technology, Dec. 8; for Technology Entry, Nov. 26.


