BCIT and OLA sign agreement on Health Sciences Degree

In June 1990, BCIT and OLA signed a Protocol of Cooperation for granting bachelor degrees. "A new era in providing higher education for B.C. residents," was the way **Wynne Powell**, BCIT alumnus and Chairman of the BCIT Board of Governors, described the signing. The agreement enables the application of BCIT credits towards a degree granted by the Open Learning Agency. Transcripts and certificates will state that they are offered in collaboration with BCIT.

Marketing grads now qualify for CIM

All Marketing graduates are now eligible for accreditation by the prestigious Canadian Chartered Institute of Marketing.

The BCIT Marketing diploma was recently accredited by the Canadian Chartered Institute of Marketing as satisfying the full educational requirement for professional membership. BCIT is the first school in Western Canada to be awarded this status.

There are three levels of membership:

Full membership for grads who have held a senior marketing level position for at least five years,

Associate membership for grads who have held a professional marketing position for at least three years, and

Graduate membership for grads who have held a professional marketing position for one year.

Marketing instructor **Terry Winder**, who applied to the Institute and is chair of the Western Canadian chapter, says the accreditation status is a marvellous networking opportunity for grads, especially if they are going to work in Eastern Canada or overseas.

"There are so many professional development activities we can organize once we have a good sized membership," says Winder, who along with Marketing head Randy Vandermark and instructor George Jacob, runs the fledgling Western Canadian chapter.

The response to the survey in the last issue was good - over 100 kind and concerned Alumni took the time to send in their comments and opinions. 66 per cent of all respondents liked the News the way it is - only 15 per cent thought it needed change.

From the survey, it is clear alumni want to see articles relating to their careers and education. But they also want articles on BCIT and Grad Gossip. News about student matters came in last as a first choice, but high as a second choice.

Nineteen per cent thought that a glossy stock would be appropriate, while 58 per cent

did not want a change, and 24 per cent were unsure. An impressive and unsolicited 30 per cent did not want any changes that would affect the environmental impact of printing the Alumni News, while 15 per cent did not want to see changes that would unneccessarily increase costs.

Only one respondent did not want to see an Alumni News.

The Alumni News is also looking for advertising. It will help us upgrade the publication, allow us to pay some writers and photographers, and print larger issues on better (but recyclable!) stock.

Advertising in the Alumni News is an excellent way to reach over 20,000 BCIT graduates, all working and wealthy (I sincerely hope!). A special advertising section will include an employment feature with free listings for alumni looking for work and paid ads for those companies wishing to hire.

We're also planning a professional guide. If you are a lawyer or an accountant or in the service industry, and a grad, this will be an excellent way to let fellow graduates know that you may be of service to them.For more information see the box on page 7 of this issue.

the second degree to be offered in cooperation with B.C. Open University.

The first degree offered under the agreement was the **Bachelor of Arts in Administrative Studies**. The B.C. Open University supplements the BCIT Advanced Business Diploma with the courses necessary to earn a full degree.

George Eisler, Dean of BCIT's School of Health Sciences, told Alumni News that Nursing, Environmental Health, and Medical Imaging would likely be the first three disciplines covered by the latest agreement. Nursing is expected to be the first off the block in September 1991.

Under this program Open University grants full credit for a nursing diploma and BCIT's "I know the value of the BCIT grad and industry's reliance on those grads for the past 25 years and more. I have talked to a few industry people unofficially about the fund raising campaign and get the feeling that we will be very successful," says Clark.

There is no doubt that Clark's extensive marketing experience and business contacts in both national and international markets will be a tremendous asset to BCIT's capital campaign, but his chairmanship also serves to enhance IBM's involvement with BCIT. To date the company has donated over \$1 million in support of student programs. In addition, IBM employees have been active on advisory boards, the Development Council, and the President's Club.

Advanced Diploma in Health Sciences. Students then supplement this training with liberal arts, social sciences, mathematics, humanities, research and a health issues course from OU for their degree.

Working health professionals throughout B.C. can also complete a degree through part-time studies without having to leave the work force for extended periods of time.

As Dean Eisler remarked: "This is the best of both worlds - academic recognition for advanced level training in a key health discipline field - with strong emphasis on applied specialty skills and knowledge."

The Open University is a component of the Open Learning Agency, established in 1988 by the B.C. legislature. The Agency also includes the Open College and the Knowledge Network.
