


The Link is home to a few regular features like Campus Query - where we ask your opinion on issues and events in the news, and Life in Hell - a comic strip drawn by Matt

# What you need to know

## FAQs regarding registration & administration

1) How many times do we have to register within the school year?

Technology Students:

Each September all students, new and returning need to register. Details are mailed to each student in mid-August.

Trade Students:

Report to classes specified on their acceptance letter.

# 2) Why are our courses already chosen for us?

The programs at BCIT are designed in conjunction with industry. The mix of courses is designed to help be a well-prepared and job ready graduate.

# 3) Why does BCIT have such a heavy course load?

BCIT's philosophy is "Learning by doing". Therefore the course load allows for an easy transition from the classroom environment to the workplace. Since we are a polytechnic institution, we are rather different than universities. By having in place the attendance rule, students are being taught how to be professionals by being on time for class.

## 4) What are the Academic Residency Requirements?

Students may be granted academic credit towards a BCIT credential based upon prior successful academic studies at other educational institutions (Transfer credit and/or Advanced Placement) and/or through credit granted based upon life and/or work experience (Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition).

In order to satisfy academic residency requirements for a BCIT credential a student must satisfactorily complete a minimum of 25% of the total required program of study at BCIT. This normally will be the terminal 25% of the program undertaken (e.g. the last year of a four year Bachelor of Technology degree program, the last semester of a two year diploma program).

This limitation may be appealed by individual programs through Education Council.

## 5) Transfer Credit

BCIT will undertake to provide students with an opportunity to use credits earned at and awarded by other post-secondary institutions, where the learning outcomes duplicate those of BCIT courses within their program.

BCIT reserves the right to determine where transfer credit will and will not be awarded and will endeavour to ensure consistency of assessment activities and the resulting award of credit.

## 6) When do we pay fees for the following term?

New Students: Fees are due 60 days in advance of the first day of classes.

Returning Students: Fees are due at the end of the first week of classes.
