The World University Service of Canada, which operates a CIDA funded vocational training project in Mpaka, Swaziland, is looking for applications from individuals with the following experience:

Successful candidates will:

- 1. Identify and develop curriculum materials in the above trades areas for Mpaka High School pre-vocational competency based training program
- 2. Train Swazi staff members at the Mpaka High School in teacher training and basic administration training
